

## White Evangelical or Born-Again Protestants by State

In July we distributed a table showing, among other things, what percentage of registered voters were evangelical or born-again white Protestants, a large group that is very supportive of President Bush. Journalists looking at particular battleground states have asked if we have data for particular states. See the table below.

\* Data from Delaware, the District of Columbia, Idaho, Maine, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Dakota, South Dakota, Rhode Island, Vermont, West Virginia, Wyoming are not included because there were too few respondents to analyze.

Results are based on interviews conducted nationally with 48,639 adults from October 7, 2003 through September 13, 2004. In theory, in 19 out of 20 cases, results for all registered voters in California will differ by no more than one percentage point, up or down, from what would have been obtained by interviewing all American adults. For Florida, Illinois, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Texas, the margin of sampling error is plus or minus 2 percentage points. For Alabama, Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Indiana, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, Oregon, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin, the margin of sampling error is plus or minus 3 percentage points. For Arkansas, Connecticut, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and South Carolina, the margin of sampling error is plus or minus 4 percentage points. For Mississippi and Utah, the margin of sampling error is plus or minus 5 percentage points.
