ANNENBERG SCIENCE KNOWLEDGE SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The Annenberg Science Knowledge (ASK) survey was conducted for the Annenberg Public Policy Center via telephone (CATI) by SSRS, an independent research company. Interviews were conducted from **June 2-June 6, 2016** among 1,023 U.S. adults, aged 18 and older, drawn from a national probability sample in all 50 states. The dual frame sample, included 611 cell phone respondents and 37 respondents who completed the survey in Spanish. Data were weighted to represent the target U.S. adult population. The adjusted margin of error for total respondents is +/- 3.67 % at the 95% confidence level. The response rate was 10% (AAPOR RR 3).
